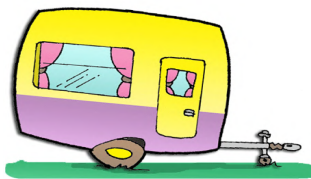
**BATEMANS BAY 13<sup>th</sup> - 15<sup>th</sup>

## EMAIL FROM OUR OUTGOING EXCHANGE STUDENT MATILDA KNIGHT

It is so crazy that it's already September. I never want to leave!

Summer was amazing. It started off with a week-long dance camp, where I made a few nice friends and sweated a lot. Then, my host parents and I went off to Piran, Slovenia, for about a week. If you don't know it, Piran is the only coastal town of Slovenia, and it was so beautiful!

After that, we went through Italy and to Tirol, an Austrian state. My host dad has some family up there, and my host mum and I went on a Glacier tour on the tallest mountain I've ever been on!

After that, they dropped me off at Villach for a second dance camp! This one was a lot bigger, we were about 50 people. It was really cool and I spoke only German for the whole week, so I was extremely tired by the end! But, quite a few people told me that I have no accent when I speak German, which felt really rewarding.

After the holiday trip was over, I took little day trips to Vienna with my other exchange friends, and other little adventures with my host family.

School is going great. We decided that I don't need to change schools, but I just changed classes. I've been at school for a week now, and I've already got some friends in the class! I can also participate in some of the class work, so it's not too boring.

The weather is starting to get a bit cold now, which I'm happy about. I can't wait to see snow again, and I think autumn will be really pretty in Austria. Hopefully I'll have time to go skiing again before I leave.

My German has gotten to the point where I feel like I don't really need to study too hard for it anymore, which is kind of bad. I should be using this time to speak and read as much German as possible. With the girls at school I speak almost always German, and mostly German at home with my host family, but sometimes we switch to English when we're having a good conversation. We did, however, have a conversation about politics in German.

My family is really amazing. I think they're almost as good as my real family!

It's good to hear about all the things you're doing with Rotary. I actually have a Rotary meeting tonight and I'm doing a short presentation on what I've done in Austria so far. And, of course, I have to do it all in German. Scary!
