The enjoyment David Ashford had on his voyage on the HMB Endeavour was very evident. He was one of 15 paying crew members (with 19 professional crew) who sailed 1070 nautical miles from Portland Victoria to

Sydney from 25 March to 6 April. The HMB Endeavour is a replica of Captain Cook's ship, length 33 metres, breadth 9 metres, height 39 metres and was built in Fremantle in 1993. Once a year it embarks on a voyage from its base at the Maritime Museum in Sydney. David and other crew members worked shift rotations and slept in hammocks. As well they learned how to handle the 78 lines of ropes which control the sails – each one has a purpose – and the intricacies of sailing such a vessel. An exciting adventure shown by David's graphic video clips!

2016 BOWELCARE PROGRAM

Bowelcare kits will be available at all local pharmacies from 1 April till 31 May. Kits cost \$15. The cost includes testing and advice of results to yourself and nominated doctor within 30 days of receipt of the kit by pathology. Kits are returned in the pre-paid envelope. There are no dietary or medical restrictions to undertake testing – one sample from two different days. HAVE YOU GOT YOUR KIT YET? The Program is being administered for our club by Bruce Gruber.

WHAT'S THE CENTURIAN PROGRAM?

To become a Centurian you need to personally give \$100 to the Rotary Foundation. It is hoped participants will make this an annual contribution. This can be done by giving \$100 outright or by giving a few dollars at each Rotary meeting. Treasurer Bruce keeps a spreadsheet record of contributions and can advise you at any time the amount of your contributions. Once \$100 is received, he sends this to the Rotary Foundation in your name. Ultimately, once your contributions total \$1000 you will receive a Paul Harris Pin. The Rotary Foundation is our charity and funds many 'good works' humanitarian programs. Club and individual contributions are invested and in three years time half what has been contributed comes back to the District to be spent on grants which clubs (including ours) apply for.
