A child receives Trivalent Oral Polio vaccination in India. The last case of Wild Type 2 Polio was identified in India in 1999. Since then, all Type 2 cases have been vaccine induced. The switch to the Bivalent (without Type 2) will eliminate the chance of vaccine induced Type 2 cases in the future.
