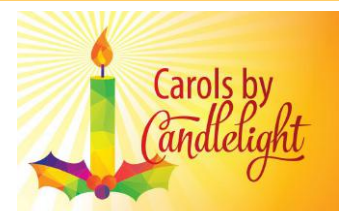

Our guest speaker last week was past RI Director Noel Trevaskis. It is enjoyable to listen to Noel because he talks very easily off the cuff and with a wonderful insight into everything Rotary. We heard about the preparation and meetings at RI headquarters in Evanston, Illinois. There are 17 Directors from 34 zones worldwide with many different cultures and requiring interpretation into 8 languages. He told us about the long days and the exhaustion he felt on returning home. As we are all aware, the average age of Rotarians in Australia is 71 and he believes the number of clubs should be reduced in order to have a larger member base for projects etc. He spoke about an exciting "New Model" soon to be launched, which may not have the Rotary name, but will attract 20 to 30 year olds who are not interested in dinner meetings but are project driven in causes such as reducing poverty, global warming and maternal health and many more areas. He advised us to talk to friends, neighbours and work colleagues about Rotary but do not use statistics, just tell your story about how you came into Rotary. Everyone has a story to tell.

Pakistan: Eight cases reported this year – most recent
 case was from Fata with an onset of paralysis on 7th
 October. (There were 8 cases in 2017)

Afghanistan: Nineteen cases reported this year- most
 recent case was from the Nawzad District, Hillmand
 Province with the onset of paralysis on 2nd October.
 (There were 14 cases in 2017)

Nigeria: On 20th August 2018 Nigeria celebrated 2 years
 without a Wild Polio case!
