NEWS FROM SAMANTHA HANLON

I arrived in Denmark, on the 15th of January 2017. For the first week I stayed at my co-councillor's house with his family. After four days I went to school, which is very different compared to Australia; the relationship between students and relaxed. The school is small and indoors and they have no school bell to tell you when

you have to go to the next class, which I found really weird. When my week with my co-councillor ended, I didn't want to leave, I had a lot of fun with the family and I felt at home with them. I moved to my first family, but it wasn't the best start, I had gotten sick with the flu. The family looked after me very well and helped me get better. Also that weekend I participated in the welcome meeting of all the exchange students in my district. Being sick I didn't talk much, but meet a nice group of Aussies. The following week I went to school, and also started playing volleyball. This past week I have been living in a boarding school, along with all the exchange students living in Denmark (most of whom are Aussies!). This week was an intro-camp where we learnt the Danish language, culture and history. As well as having fun. It was a long week, but I have made friends that will last a life time. When I come home, I spent a couple of hours before leaving to go watch my little host sister play a game of handball, then going to a local soccer (football) club to meet the team that I will start to play with. My host family are also helping me with my Danish, my host mum got a children's book to read together, and when we sit at the dinner table when having meals, they tell me what the food is then get me to repeat it. I think it's safe to say I am getting better every day. Everyone is really nice and always happy to help me out when I don't understand what they are talking about. Everything has been great! No difficulties whatsoever!!
